## Keeping the Show on the Road

Brian Torr N6IYY led another social-distanced VE session on Saturday, September 26. This was held at a medical office complex near the former Palm Drive Hospital in Sebastopol. Thanks go to Bill Hillendahl KH6GJV for offering the location.

Helping Bill and Brian were John Breckenridge WB6FRZ, Darryl Paule KI6MSP, Ann Ivan KM6QIW, Mike Von der Porten AD6YB, and Dave McQuate WA8YWQ.



Everyone who came to be tested had at least one success. Six new tech licenses were issued. Two candidates passed two elements to join amateur radio as a general. The last candidate passed all three elements so join the hobby as an extra. The testing was done with applicants in their own cars. One proctor monitored two test-takers. The three grading stations and the administrative station were at separate tables ten feet apart. Five candidates were tested in the first session and four in the second. Applicants were required to have an FRN to come to the session. Brian then submitted the results to the ARRL-VEC electronically. The ARRL-VEC sends the forms to the FCC. 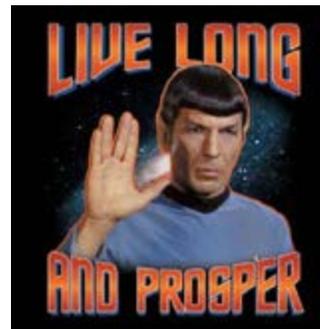

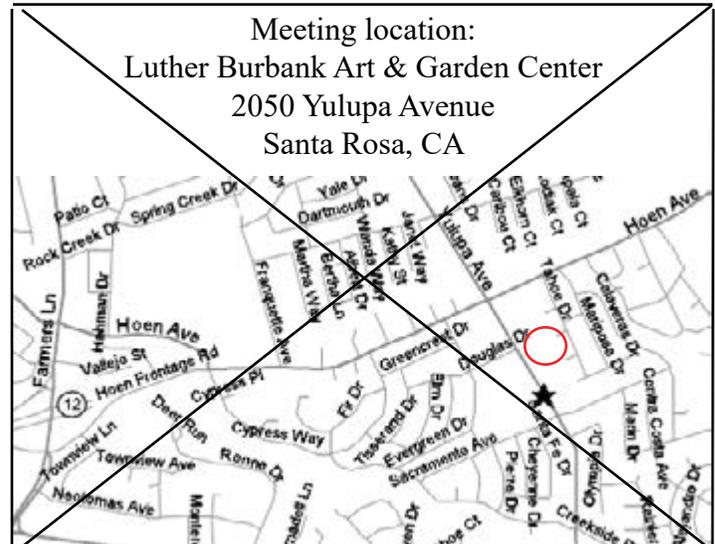

The club's DMR footprint continues to expand! We established a beachhead on DMR and the BrandMeister network of repeaters and hotspots by adding a talk group for Sonoma County. We are using talk group number 31707 to keep in touch on DMR and be able to discuss local news and topics of interest. The use of a talk group like 31707 allows a wider variety of Sonoma County DMR hams to be able to consistently reach each other on the air. Best of all, the 31707 talk group can be reached on hotspots as well as repeaters, meaning you can tie into your local community wherever you are!

We also started a DMR net for Sonoma County (using talk group 31707) that lets us practice a little bit of traffic handling, while also allowing us to get together and talk about ways we can integrate DMR into our normal operating habits. ## CONTEST CORNER

Welcome to Contest Corner for October 2020.

This month we had the California QSO Party this past weekend. I hope some of you had fun with that.

Of note, from ARRL a first time contest:

The new Portable Operations Challenge is October 3 and 4, 2020. The operator may choose any 8-hour contiguous period during the 48 hours of the event to operate. Contest scores are based on a kilometers-per-watt metric, and operation is to take place on 80, 40, 20, 15, and 10 meters. While non-portable stations can compete, the contest rules are biased towards portable operating. See the rules for the score calculation, exchange, restrictions, and the special rule requiring a "Data security and handling conditions text statement" to be submitted with each log entry. NCJ is a sponsor, however this is not an official ARRL or NCJ contest.

This coming weekend is the Arizona QSO party, so if you missed the California contest, you can get in on this one right next door.

[Jamboree-on-the-Air](#) - Unfortunately, with COVID-19 restrictions, we will not have an event locally. JOTA is a global event, though, so the International Radio Scouting personell have gone ahead with plans and it is up to local councils to comply with local regulations for participation. We have nothing formal planned locally, as the Redwood BSA council is sticking to virtual scouting. So you can participate by being available for contact on Oct. 17.

### New Amateur Extra Question Pool Released

01/27/2020 (<http://arrl.org>)

The new Amateur Extra-class license examination question pool, effective from July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2024, has been released and is available at the [National Conference of Volunteer Coordinators \(NCVEC\) website](#).

The [2020 – 2024 Extra-class pool](#) incorporates significant changes compared to the 2016 – 2020 question pool, which expired on June 30. The number of questions in the pool was reduced from 712 to 622. The result was 239 modified questions, 49 new questions, and 139 questions removed due to changes in what was felt to be an abundance of outdated questions, while areas of new technology and subjects were added.

In addition, an effort was made to balance the difficulty level, removing or replacing some questions deemed too easy or too difficult compared to the rest of the pool. The 2020 pool has 10 diagrams, which have been renumbered because the new question pool has two fewer than the 2016 question pool.
