

MARCH OF DIMES SUPERWALK 1980

This year's walkathon will be held on March 23, Sunday, and SCRA & SCARS will be assisting with communications. Checkpoints will be at Piner and Industrial Dr., Piner Elementary School, and the Willowside School. Start and Finish (and NCS) will be at SRJC, Emeritus Hall. Communications will be needed between these points and with various roving vehicles for water delivery, poop-out, etc. The event will begin at 8AM and conclude at 5PM, thus our communications help can be broken down into two shifts of about $4\frac{1}{2}$ hours each.

We will probably use 146.52 as primary freq., and 146.13/.73 for secondary. Anyone who can volunteer should contact Scott, WA7UVE, as soon as they can and indicate if they can operate portable or mobile only, and if they have a van or truck and are willing to be a rover. In some cases our operators may be teamed with non-ham drivers, so we also need to know if you can operate from a cigarette lighter and with a magmount antenna.

This should be an excellent opportunity to practice our emergency communications skills, and it ought to be a lot of fun too! If you've not done this sort of thing before, why not give it a try?

SUGGESTION:

THE FOLLOWING IS SUBMITTED AS A HELPFUL SUGGESTION TO BE USED AS A POSSIBLE OPERATING GUIDE FOR EVENTS SUCH AS THE WALK-A-THON

- 1. A more or less formal NET type operation is probably the best way to handle a Public Service Project.
- 2. Each frequency (usually only 1) is under the control of a NET control station, located "centrally."
- 3. Under this kind of directed NET operation, a station with traffic of ANY kind only need say his call ONCE then wait for acknowledgement from the NCS.
- 4. All transmissions should be kept as short as possible. Avoid rambling by thinking about what you're going say before transmitting.
- 5. Be clear, distinct, and accurate. If you're reporting some activity or occurance, relate specifics without embellishment and either omit any conjecture or preface it as such.
- 6. Beware of excess enthusiasm it can short circuit good judgement. In times of stress, you must have control of yourself before you can control a situation effectively.

THE ARRL DX QSL BUREAU SYSTEM

<u>Purpose</u>

Within the U.S. and Canada, the ARRL DX QSL Bureau System is made up of 22 call area bureaus that act as central clearing houses for QSLs arriving from foreign countries. These "incoming" bureaus are staffed by volunteer workers. The service is free and ARRL membership is not required.

How it Works

Most countries have "outgoing" QSL bureaus that operate in much the same manner as the ARRL-Membership Overseas QSL Service. The member sends his cards to his outgoing bureau where they are packaged and shipped to the appropriate countries.

A majority of the DX QSLs are shipped directly to the individual incoming bureaus where volunteer workers sort the incoming QSLs by the first letter of the call sign suffix. One individual may be assigned the responsibility of handling from one to three letters of the alphabet.

Claiming your QSLs

Send a 5 X 7 1/2 inch self-addressed, stamped envelope to the bureau serving your district. Neatly print your call sign in the upper left corner of the envelope. A preferred way to send envelopes is to affix a 15¢ stamp and clip extra postage to the envelope. Then, if you receive more than 1 oz. of cards, they can be sent in the single package.

Some incoming bureaus sell envelopes or postage credits in addition to the normal handling of s.a.s.e.s. They provide the proper envelope and postage upon prepayment of a certain fee. The exact arrangements can be obtained by sending your inquiry with an s.a.s.e. to your area bureau. A list of bureaus can be found below.

<u>Helpful</u> Hints

Good cooperation between the DXer and the bureau is important to ensure a smooth flow of cards. Remember that the people who work in the area bureaus are volunteers. They are providing you with a free but valuable service. With that thought in mind, please pay close attention to the following DOs and DONTs.

DOs

- Do keep self-addressed 5 X 7 1/2" envelopes on file at your bureau, with your call in the upper left corner, and affix at least one unit of first-class postage.
- Do send the bureau enough postage to cover envelopes on file and enough to take care of possible postage rate increases.
- Do respond quickly to any bureau request for envelopes, stamps or money. Unclaimed card backlogs are the bureau's biggest problem.
- Do notify the bureau of your new call as you upgrade.
- Do include an s.a.s.e. with any information request to the bureau.
- Do notify the bureau in writing if you don't want your cards.
- Do be appreciative of the fine efforts of these volunteers.

DON'Ts

- Don't expect DX cards to arrive for several months after the QSO.
 Overseas delivery is very slow.
 Many cards coming from overseas bureaus are over a year old.
- Don't send your outgoing DX cards to this bureau (see the bulletin, "ARRL - Membership Overseas QSL Service").
- Don't send envelopes to your "portable" bureau. For example, WAISQB/2 sends envelopes to the WI bureau, not the W2 bureau.

ARRL-M BERSHIP OVERSEAS QS. . AVICE

Purpose

This is an "outgoing" service that allows ARRL members to send DX QSL cards to foreign countries at a minimum of cost and effort.

Advantages

While QSLing direct to foreign amateurs is faster, it is also more tedious. Time spent searching for addresses in the foreign Callbook, addressing and stuffing envelopes, and mailing could be better spent operating DX. And, the cost of IRCs, airmail postage, and envelopes can be prohibitive.

An unlimited number of QSLs may be sent for distribution 12 times per year. The fee is just \$1.00 per pound or portion thereof (155 QSL cards average a pound).

Additional Notes

The ARRL-Membership Overseas QSL Service operates ONLY in an "outgoing" capacity. To receive QSLs from DX stations, see the information sheet entitled The ARRL DX QSL BUREAU SYSTEM.

U.S. amateurs may send SWL reports to foreign short-wave listeners.

Unlicensed (associate) members may send SWL cards to foreign amateurs.

QSL managers: Write for details.

Requirements

- Pre-sort your DX QSLs alphabetically by callsign prefix (A3, AP, C6, CE F, FG, G, GI, GM, JA, 3A2, etc.).
- Enclose the address label from the brown wrapper of your current copy of <u>QST</u>. This information shows that you are a current ARRL member.

Family members may also use the service by enclosing their QSLs with those of the primary member. Include the appropriate fee with each individuals cards and indicate "family membership."

Sightless members who do not receive <u>QST</u> should indicate that the QSLs are from a "sightless member."

ARRL affiliated club stations may utilize the service when submitting club QSLs by indicating the club name. Club secretaries should check affiliation papers to ensure that membership is current.

 Enclose payment in the form of a check, money order, or cash.
 Sending large amounts of cash through the mail is not suggested. Please do

not send stamps.

This is a current list of countries for which QSLs may be forwarded. Keep in mind that QSLs received for countries that do not have bureaus will be held until such time as a distribution point exists. In the interest of economics and efficiency, QSLs cannot be returned.


