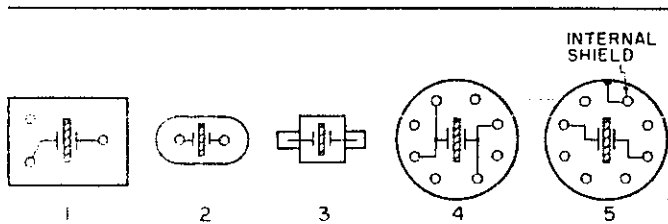

# IDENTIFYING SURPLUS CRYSTALS

At the present time, there are still a large number of surplus military crystals available. While frequencies are occasionally marked on these crystals, there is little other information given. The table was compiled to provide a reference for most crystals used by the military from 1940 to the present. Electrical characteristics and basing are provided. ▲

THEN THE PRESENT UNIT WILL BE MOVED DOWN FROM THE VAULT AND COMPLETELY REPAIRED. A NEW 450 MHZ RECEIVER MUST BE INSTALLED AS THE OLD ONE DOES NOT WORK WELL ENOUGH.

WHEN XTALS ARRIVE THE LOANER WILL BE TESTED, A TWO MINUTE TIMER WILL BE INSTALLED AND THE IDER CHANGED FROM THE OLD MACHINE OVER TO THE LOANER.

The General Club meeting was held May 4, 1983 in the EOC of the County Administration Center and called to order at 7:45 pm by Al Bloom, N1AL. Minutes of the April meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's report was given by Bill, WD6DXW and approved. The ending balance for the General Fund for March was \$1324.90.

Committee reports as follows:

REPEATER: Terry, WA6RNF and Al, N1AL stated that they had just been up to the repeater site on Tuesday, May 3, and cleaned the high voltage relay contacts. They will be listening for further problems.

ACTIVITIES: Al, KD6NT reported that the March of Dimes Walk-a-Thon went well, despite the rain. Hank, W6DTV passed around an article that appeared in the Petaluma Argus Courier on April 29 giving the club credit for its communications support during the Walk-a-Thon. The Field Day Co-Chairmen were announced as Steve, WABLLY and Steve, KD6BC. See them if you want to participate. The club has also been asked to provide communications for the "Tin-Man Marathon" to be held in June 11 in Santa Rosa.

TRAILER: Hoppy, Sr., K6MUP has welded the tongue onto the trailer.

EDUCATION: Spence WA6IXC reported that the Novice Class is now 3 in number and all 3 have reached 5 wpm. The Form 610's have been sent in requesting the Novice Exams. Remember, the class is held each Friday at 7:30 pm in the EOC. Al KD6NT is conducting the theory and regulations, Spence is handling the code.

BADGES: I announced those that had arrived since the last meeting.

QSL: Jim, W6CYM recently received one card to QSL the Alcatraz DXpedition (4 years ago).

PUBLIC SERVICE COORDINATOR: Van, W6GFY requested advance notice (2 weeks or more) of upcoming events so that he can make arrangements with reporters and TV people.

FIELD DAY: Steve, WABLLY requested that a list be passed out during the meeting of those interested in Field Day.

Old Business:

1. Al, N1AL, read that there is now a County Ordinance prohibiting smoking in County buildings. He also read the Pacific Division Director's letter, which stated that the ARRL has come out as totally opposed to any No-Code License.
2. A rather lively discussion over whether to purchase a new 2 meter repeater basically concluded that the Board of Directors should review the comments of the members. The main task for the Board is to assess the pro's and con's of such a major purchase vs. repairing the machine, whether the club's current status with the county will be altered, and whether the club will have any more control over the repeater if the club owns the machine. Also for consideration is configuring a portable 2 meter repeater for use when the main machine is out.
3. During the 2 meter repeater discussion, the issue of the 6 meter repeater was brought forward by Don, WA6ACX, who moved that the club sell it. This was seconded by Chuck, N6DDK. During the discussion that followed, it was generally felt that the club should try to sell the 6 M machine while we can still get some money out of it. The motion was approved unanimously. The Board will look into the means for selling it.

New Business:

1. The VL Net will be hosting a pot luck at 6:30 pm, May 13 at the Bellevue School on Primrose Ave. The program will be slides on a trip to Africa. Everyone is invited to attend.
2. Al, N1AL will be working on a new preamble for the Tuesday night Club Net (13/73 at 7:30 pm).
3. Zane, WB6SRU donated the prizes for the evening's raffle.

The business meeting adjourned at 9:15 pm. An excellent program on the Clipperton Island DXpedition, consisting of both slides and an audio tape done by one of the participants, was presented by Len, K6ANP. --- Doug, WA0JRB Secretary.

(1.) - Noting that VECs will be faced with significant expenses and that "...surely it was never the intent of Congress... that... volunteers should suffer unreimbursed out-of-pocket expenses in the course of volunteering their services" the ARRL "feels that the Commission must permit the VEC to charge a nominal mandatory fee to cover expenses of running the program. The fees cannot, however, be a money-making source of income for the VEC, but should be held to a minimum to cover actual expenses, such as postage, printing and necessary administrative costs. The League would require such a fee in order to participate in the program as a VEC."

(2.) - "...the League proposes that prior public notice of examination session information... be required" with deadlines for applicants to register in advance. Special provisions were suggested for examining handicapped applicants.

(3.) - Local examination teams or organizations should be permitted to underwrite the cost of printing extra examination booklets "to handle walk-in applicants who have not registered in advance." VEC to provide camera ready copies of all examinations.

(4.) - Ham examinations should be changed every month to maintain the security and integrity of the amateur testing program. Applicants who fail a test "must wait until the following calendar month before retesting." FCC should retain in the rules a clear statement of its prerogative to recall any licensed operator for an FCC-administered test.

(5.) - Even though the FCC did not propose to make Novice exams part of the volunteer testing program, the League wanted this with both Morse code sending and receiving tests required and written test questions taken from an approved pool of questions.

(6.) - The current 10 question code test should be retained for Technician and higher class applicants. No sending test unless applicant previously unlicensed. Volunteer examiners can prepare their own code test or use one provided by the VEC. Code Test Credit Certificates (for those that pass the code but not the written test) should be permitted at the option of the VEC.

(7.) - The three examiner rule should be waived and a single examiner permitted in extreme cases where three accredited volunteer examiners are not available.

(8.) - The VEC and not the chief examiner (as proposed by the FCC) should be required to retain the completed test answer sheets. The applicant should be provided only with the percentage of questions answered correctly.

(9.) - A more liberal format for volunteer examiners was proposed by the ARRL with only those directly engaged in amateur radio related businesses and publishing being precluded from participation.

(10.) - The League asked that the Commission issue an "explicit statement of qualification standards or decision criteria" for appointment of VECs (national coordinators.) They suggested that a VEC should be a "national, not-for-profit entity, directly involved in the promotion of amateur radio activity." If this is adopted by the FCC, it is very doubtful that any organization except the ARRL, the QCWA and possibly the Society of Wireless Pioneers could qualify. So far, only the QCWA and the League has expressed an interest in being VECs.

(11.) - The League said "Circumstances indicate that the League may well be the only organization in a position to fulfill the VEC function" and that it was the "best suited." "This program, if enacted, will provide further opportunities for Amateur Radio operators to serve the public interest and invest themselves in the future well-being of the Amateur Radio Service." The ARRL asked that their suggested changes be adopted in a Report and Order.

MINUTES OF THE APRIL 1983 BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The Board of Directors meeting was held at 7:45 pm, April 13, 1983 in the EOC and called to order by Al Bloom, N1AL.

1. Al, N1AL wondered whether we invite guest stations on the Tuesday night net to the club meeting--Spence will look into it.
2. Al sent in the club's response for the Volunteer Examiner Program.
3. The trailer pink slip: transfer to SCRA was found to be valid as explained by Don, WA6ACX.
4. Constitution and By-Laws are now re-typed. Hank will handle making the copies.
5. Al stated that we need more "Welcome to SCRA" letters to hand out to new members. (Note from me: I have not seen one, and did not get one when I became a member in May 1982.--5/8/83)
6. A proposal for the 2 meter repeater was drafted:
  - a. We need to investigate purchasing a commercial vs. amateur.
  - b. There must be a written agreement between SCRA and the County.
  - c. A consensus of the board agreed to purchase a new machine.
7. Armed Forces Day--Al is waiting for a return phone call.
