EVENTUALLY THE CRRL WILL COLLECT AND RETAIN ALL DUES FROM CANADIAN MEMBERS IN CANADA. EVEN LONG TIME FOE OF THE JOINT U.S./CANADIAN AMATEUR POSITION, RON HESLER, VE1SH, IS COMING BACK INTO THE FOLD.

PROGRESS....ALASKAN EXTRA CLASS CALLS HAVE NOW BEEN ASSIGNED AND GROUP "B" CALLS ARE BEING ASSIGNED TO EXTRA CLASS THERE. THERE ARE ONLY 7 MORE EXTRA CLASS CALLS LEFT IN HAWAII!

FCC UPDATES THIRD PARTY TRAFFIC LIST.... THE FCC HAS UPDATED THEIR LIST OF COUNTRIES WITH WHICH THE AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE CAN PARTICIPATE IN THIRD PARTY COMMUNICATIONS. THE COMMISSION SAID THAT ALL MESSAGES PASSED MUST BE "UNIMPORTANT", NON BUSINESS, PERSONAL-TYPE TRAFFIC.

ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA, ARGENTINA, AUSTRALIA, BOLIVIA, BRAZIL, CANADA, CHILE, COLOMBIA, COSTA RICA, CUBA, DOMINICA, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC, ECUADOR, EL SALVADOR, THE GAMBIA, GHANA, GRENADA, GUATEMALA, GUYANA, HAITI, HONDURAS, ISRAEL, JAMAICA, JORDAN, LIBERIA, MEXICO, NICARAGUA, PANAMA, PARAGUAY, PERU, ST VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES, ST. LUCIA, SWAZILAND TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO, URUGUAY, VENEZUELA, 4UUITU/SWITZERLAND...

THE FCC REMINDED THE AMATEURS THAT AT THE END OF AN EXCHANGE OF INTERNATIONAL TRAFFIC OF THE THIRD PARTY TYPE EACH AMATEUR MUST TRANSMIT THE CALL SIGN OF THE FOREIGN STATION IN ADDITION TO ITS OWN CALL SIGN AS REQUIRED BY PART 97.84.

IBM HAS ANNOUNCED THAT IT HAS FABRICATED AN IC CHIP THAT IS TEN TIMES FASTER THAN ANY YET REPORTED! THE MICROCHIP CAN EXECUTE 100 MILLION MULTIPLICATIONS PER SECOND. IT IS ONLY A QUARTER OF AN INCH SQUARE AND HAS 37,000 CIRCUITS!

EVERY YEAR AT DAYTON, I TRY TO FIND A NEW TECHNOLOGY SNEAKING INTO AMATEUR RADIO. CODE READERS, COMPUTER-INTERFACED RTTY, AMATEUR EARTH STATIONS WERE NEW TO ME IN PRIOR YEARS. LAST YEAR, I SAW AMTOR ERROR-FREE RTTY TERMINALS. THIS YEAR PACKET RADIO EMERGED WITH COMMERCIAL OFFERINGS BY BOTH AEA (ADVANCED ELECTRONIC APPLICATIONS, INC.) AND TAPR, THE TUCSON AMATEUR PACKET RADIO CORP. (PO BOX #22888, TUCSON, AZ 85734.

PACKET RADIO IS A MEANS OF DIGITAL COMMUNICATIONS NOT TOO MUCH UNLIKE LRTTY OR AMTOR EXCEPT (AT 1200 BAUD) ABOUT 15 QSOS CAN BE SUPPORTED (MULTIPLEXED) SIMULTANEOUSLY ON A PACKET CHANNEL-EACH HAVING THE EQUIVALENT OF 60 WPM RTTY. A VERY EFFICIENT USE OF THE RADIO SPECTRUM INDEED. IT IS MORE LIKE POINT-TO-POINT, RATHER THAN A BROADCAST MEDIUM IN THAT IT IS ADDRESSABLE TO A PARTICULAR TERMINAL.

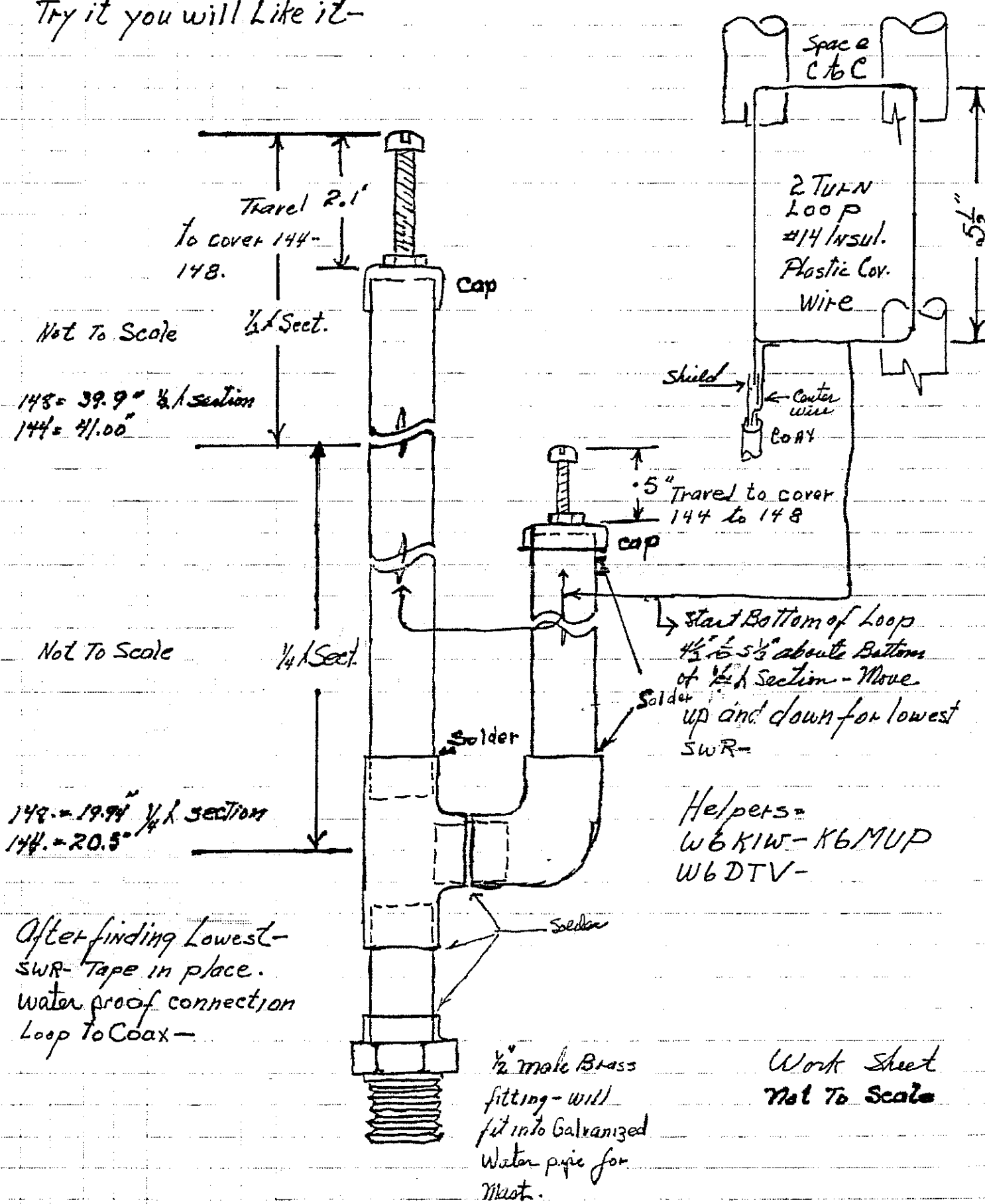
