Fox-Hunters to the Rescue – Almost!

In January, our local Ham community was called to action to help a couple in Rohnert Park. They had been experiencing interference problems on their television (they're not cable-TV subscribers) every night from 7:30 to 10:30 PM for the previous four months. Out of frustration, they resorted to driving around their area looking for anyone with an antenna they thought might be causing the problem. After calling the FCC to do something about the problem, they were referred the local Amateur Radio club for help. Steve, KV6A, took their call and gave them some preliminary help by telling them how to rotate their TV antenna to attempt to get a bearing on the source of the problem. Steve also enlisted the help of the local Fox-Hunting contingent to track down the cause of the interference.

Dave, KD6KWM, moved into action with a call to Chris, KE6MNR, who offered to bring out a DF unit and spectrum analyzer to track the interference source. However, when Dave followed up with the couple in Rohnert Park he found they had discovered the source of the "malicious" interference that had been plaguing them for so long. One evening, the woman had gone to bed early. She soon noticed that every time the interference started she was hearing a 'click' in the bedroom. The click she heard was the thermostat on the electric blanket turning on and off. They were turning on their electric blanket each evening at approximately 7:30 PM before they went to bed. Needless to say, the blanket was returned the following day. The woman thanked Dave and was glad that she had somewhere to go for help with the problem.

This story remind us we need to be very careful about these types of interference situations. Even though the source of the problem was in their own home, the first thing these people did was jump to the conclusion that it must be 'someone out there' with an antenna. As Ham Radio Operators, we need to be aware that people will make these kinds of assumptions because they do not understand how radio works. As more and more electronic devices get introduced into people's homes, these types of interference problems will become more and more frequent. We need to make sure we are working with the community to help them understand the causes of interference. The more we do this, the less likely it will be that we get lots of people trying to stop us from putting up antennas or supporting attempts to reallocate our frequency bands. Anything you can do to help your local community understand and solve these types of problems -- even when the sources are not related to Amateur Radio-- will go a long way towards helping gain support for our continued operation in the future.

However, the event did serve as a superb training ground. Not only for seasoned individuals and new Hams who got first hand experience at what we do, but for our organization as a whole. It's only been 8 or 9 months since we moved to the SEMS management format, and only 3 or 4 months since we completed the changeover from the more independent RACES structure to the ACS structure, which is more closely affiliated with the Department of Emergency Services.

This event gave us a superb opportunity to test these new arrangements and the procedures that we put into place with the SOP manual that was recently adopted.






