Mail Disruptions Lead to Vanity Processing Suspension

Recently announced changes in how the FCC's Gettysburg office is receiving and handling mail have effectively halted processing of Amateur Radio vanity call sign applications. The ARRL has learned that the FCC has processed vanity applications received through October 14 and that vanity applications received after that date remain on hold for the time being.

"We understand that mail directed to the FCC Gettysburg office beginning October 15 was being held pending the start of special handling precautions to address any biohazard contamination concerns," said ARRL VEC Manager Bart Jahnke, W9JJ. On a positive note, Jahnke said, the FCC is tracking the receipt date for each piece of mail.

Because the FCC gives equal priority to paper and electronic vanity applications, Jahnke explained, all vanity processing was being suspended until the mail situation is resolved. Citing a need for heightened security measures, the FCC announced November 14 that it had moved the Gettysburg office's mailroom offsite, to the rear entrance of 35 York St, Gettysburg, PA 17325.

The FCC did not announce, however, that mail received at Gettysburg starting October 15 had not yet been opened, pending arrangements to handle it without the possibility of endangering personnel. Jahnke said vanity processing should resume once the FCC begins to open its mail backlog. Just when that might happen is not yet known. Vanity processing typically takes 18 days.

The Gettysburg office is where the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau processes Amateur Radio applications and issues licenses. It's also where Special (continued on page 3)

ARES Comm Log

Have you noticed lately that ARES activations have increased? Just last week Amateur Radio emergency teams were activated for the American Airlines crash in New York and Hurricane Michelle in Florida. In the case of hurricanes damage is so widespread that ham radio is normally the only type of communications that is reliable. However, when was the last time you heard of an ARES activation for a plane crash?

I believe recent events have changed many officials' point of view with regards to ham radio. Obviously, the terrorist catastrophe in New York on September 11th brought Amateur Radio communication to the forefront; in fact, emergency communications teams are still being used at ground zero. However, I find it interesting how quickly and efficiently ARES was activated for Red Cross and Salvation Army relief efforts at the Queens plane crash site. Telephone cables were destroyed by the crash, cell phone communication was spotty at best, the Nextels were not working most of the time, and power was cut off to the entire area. In this type of event you would normally expect relief officials to plod along without communications support until conventional methods were brought back online. In this instance emergency communications were activated immediately after the crash facilitating both the shelter activity and the Family Information Center.

This is exactly how ARES should operate.... seamlessly. The objective is to get in quickly, do the job, and get out when conventional communications are restored. It's a shame that the World Trade Center event became a training ground for this type of emergency response but I find it gratifying that ham radio was able to "step up to the plate" and operate so efficiently. As much as we dislike it, disasters are a part of life. They will continue to occur and we can choose whether or not to be ready for them. I encourage all amateurs to get involved in ARES and our served agencies and to take the emergency communications courses currently being offered by the ARRL.

The ARES net meets on Mondays at 7:30 PM on 146.73 (- offset, 88.5 PL). We conduct periodic emergency exercises and educational sessions. Please join us.

Counsel for Amateur Radio Enforcement Riley Hollingsworth has his office.

Jahnke said the mailroom situation also could affect some Amateur Radio renewals. He said amateurs who filed timely renewal applications may continue to operate beyond a license's expiration date, if the mail delays cause the license to lapse before the renewal occurs. "For persons filing for renewal near the end of their two-year grace period, their applications will be accepted for processing if they arrive at FCC before the grace period expires."

The FCC said the US Postal Service will continue to accept and will divert all mail addressed to 1270 Fairfield Road, Gettysburg--the office's physical location--to the off-site mailroom. Until November 30, the FCC itself will divert overnight courier deliveries for 1270 Fairfield Road to the off-site mailroom.
