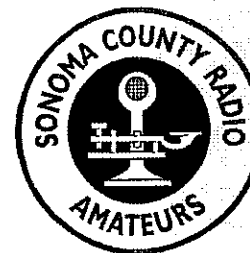

When All Else Fails

It is Sunday Afternoon. Field Day 2007 is now recent history. I've survived two days and two nights camping out in "emergency" conditions in a cloddy field in southeast Santa Rosa; on a cot in a tent, with no shower, and lots of dust and grime. This is about as far from the normal amenities and comforts of regular daily life as I want to venture. Yet, through it all, we who participated with SCRA's Field Day came away with a tremendous sense of accomplishment and satisfaction.

The ARRL-sponsored Field Day event demonstrates to every community across our vast country that in a real emergency, when all else fails, amateur radio operators are prepared to step in and provide vital communications. Field Day shows we know how to assemble effective radio communications stations in relatively inhospitable conditions, operate those stations over a continuous twenty-four hour period without relying on the local power grid, and effectively exchange communications messages with as many other field stations as possible across the land.

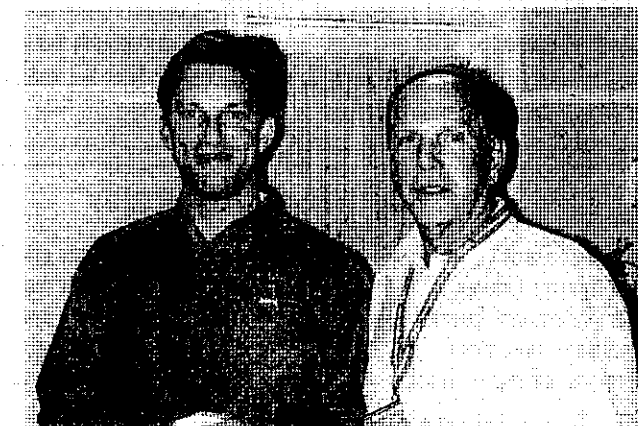
We are particularly proud of the fact that SCRA's "Get On The Air" station, operated by Technician class licensees, and lay people without licenses, (under the direct control of an appropriately licensed control operator) logged over 200 contacts on 40 meter sideband, including late night contacts with East Coast stations. The new hams and young people who operated our GOTA station obtained an invaluable insight into one of the key attractions of amateur radio.

We have so many people to thank for our field day success. I'd particularly like to thank Brian, N6IYY for designing and directing set up of our antenna systems. John, WB6FRZ provided overall operational guidance and direction for our stations (John had a well equipped portable electronics repair facility in his immaculate large tent). John, KE5RI arranged for our location and sanitary facilities. Fred, KQ6OB handled public information. Mike, KC6UNA provided our Burma Shave signs lining the shoulder approaches of Highway 12 which explained what we were

doing in the plowed field. And, Joy, KI6ASJ provided excellent food preparation and food logistics services. Thanks to all of our members who came out to our site and helped out with setup, operations, and teardown. And finally, a very special thanks to Lee, KE6EAQ for providing SCRA with a storage location for the SCRA field equipment (and records, etc.). We hope to present a slide show of our Field Day operations at the July 5th meeting.

June also marked the high point of our public service calendar. SCRA provided extensive and effective communications support for the Terrible Two bicycle event. More than one member told me that the "TT" was a great experience for handling and passing radio traffic. Thanks to Craig, K6XLT for heading up our public service activities. And many thanks to our members for participating in our public service events, at the TT, and at others throughout the year.

Our next meeting, Thursday, July 5th, will cover the basics of setting up a simple high frequency station. We'll have an important vote concerning our bylaws and a motion to repeal the existing SCRA constitution, effective when the new Articles and Bylaws are in place. Hope to see you at our July 5th meeting.

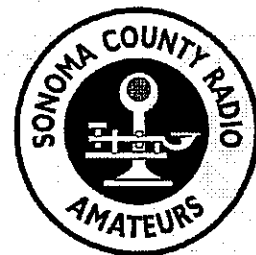

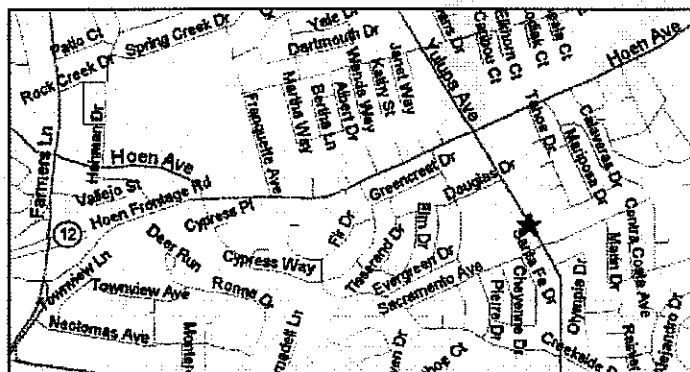


SCRA Club Meetings

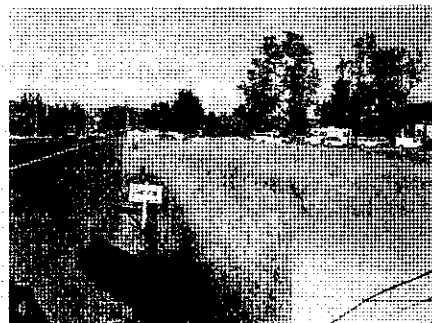

Sonoma County Radio Amateurs, Inc. Board of Directors Meeting, June 13, 2007 Minutes

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Sonoma County Radio Amateurs, Inc., held at Narsi's Hof Brau, Coddington Mall, Santa Rosa, was called to order at 6:45 PM on June 13, 2007. A quorum comprised Dave, W6IBC; Brian, K6IYY; John, KE5RI; and Pat, KG6JSL. Absent were Fred KQ6OB and Bob KG6ZDN. John WB6FRZ attended and participated in the Field Day discussion.

Old Business:

Minutes of the last Board of Directors Meeting were approved.
 Repeater: John KE5RI discussed the repeater coordination issue. John and Dave agreed to make careful signal strength measurements of the competing repeater seeking coordination and report the results to NARCC.

Bylaws: Pat KG6JSL reported on the progress of the Bylaws in light of comments by one member, Bill KH6GJV. The board resolved to appoint all committee chairs. The dues will be set by the members at the annual meeting. The annual meeting will be the November election meeting. The club and board of directors meeting days and places to be set by resolution of the Board of Directors. Pat KG6JSL agreed to make these changes to the current draft. A formal motion will be prepared and presented at the July 2007 membership meeting to repeal the club's present constitution. A vote on the repeal will be held at the September 2007 meeting.
 Toaster: Pat KG6JSL reported that he could store the Toaster at his home for the foreseeable future. Pat continues to make repairs to this vehicle.

Field Day: Final preparations were made. The setup crew will meet at Lee Dibble's home at 2PM on Friday June 22nd to collect necessary equipment and conduct an equipment inventory at that location. We will need members to help with setup on Friday and tear down on Sunday. The setup crew hopes to erect the tower and triband beam on Friday, at a minimum. Equipment, power, sanitary facilities, and food menus were approved.

New Business:

July 2007 meeting will be led by Dave, W6IBC, and will cover the basics of setting up a simple high frequency ham radio station. Also, the bylaws will be presented at the July 2007 meeting for a vote on adoption by the members.

Pacific Coast Air Museum Show, August 18, 19. Brian, N6IYY, has submitted the application and we are awaiting word from PCAM regarding acceptance. The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 PM.

Sonoma County Radio Amateurs, Inc. Membership Meeting, June 6, 2007 Minutes

1. Call to Order - President Dave W6IBC called the meeting to order at 7:05 at the Luther Burbank Arts and Garden Center.

2. Program - Michael Polkinghorn gave a stimulating talk on digital radio. The first digital radio started with CW. In the 1920's there was Hellsreiber followed by RTTY in the 1940's. RTTY is still a part of HAM contesting. AMTOR was introduced in the 1980's. This was the first mode with error correction. This was followed in the mid 1980's with PACKET. This was the first mode to send binary files. This mode is still used for APRES and HF spotting reporting. In the early 1990's the first DPS systems were introduced with PACTOR, Clovor and G-TOR. When sound cards were incorporated into computers in the late 1990's, PSK-31,

PACTOR II and III (WINDLINK) were introduced. This was followed by MT-63 and MFSK-16. Today there are several new levels of signal processing including TROB, GISX25, DOMINO and PSK-63. These new systems use special programs like WINLINK (similar to the internet) WSJT (used to communicate via meteor scatter), and APRS (Automated Position Reporting System). All that is needed to use these new digital modes is a computer, and interface (sound card, TNC), and a radio. In the future, all radio will be going digital. We now have digital commercial radio. We also have D-STAR FM radio. Other digital modes include DIGIPAN (SW) and Mix-W (also SW). Following the PowerPoint presentation, there was a video demonstration of D-STAR and PSK-31.

3. Business Meeting

- Secretary's Report - The minutes from the May's meeting were approved.
- Treasurer's Report - Brian N6IYY reported that membership renewals are still a little behind. Repeater - John KE5RI reported that a new repeater (KE6JTK) has applied for coordination on our Frequency. Their PL is 131.8. Any member experiencing interference from this repeater should document it and send it to John Felton. We have filed an objection to the coordination of this repeater.
- Greg, AC6VJ, reported that the CONDOR net is now available in N. California via the repeater on Mt. Vaca on 223.84 with a PL of 141.3. Greg is also looking for people who would be interested in a class on repeaters.
- Public Service - Craig K6XLT indicated that additional volunteers are needed for the Terrible Twos on June 16th. He will also need volunteers for the Wave to Wine on September 29-30.
- ARES - Fred Polkinghorn indicated that ARES needs additional volunteers. It is very important for amateurs interested in emergency service to sign up now in order to get their ID badges and be trained. Minimum training is ISO 100, ISO 700 and ECOMM I.
- VE Sessions - Brian N6IYY announced that a VE session was conducted on Saturday June 9. Registration will start at 9AM. Cost is \$14.

4. Old Business

- By-Laws - Dave W6IBC reported that the board has received numerous comments regarding the suggested changes to the By-Laws.
