



Ham Radio: Alive and Well at the Airshow and Beyond

As I write these words to you, we've just completed a busy and very successful weekend of SCRA activities. On

Saturday August 18th, our Club provided public service communications for the YWCA Wine Country Bicycle Event based out of Windsor. Public Service Director Craig, K6XLT planned and executed this event, while Pat, KG6JSL acted as net control out of the SCRA Toaster, parked along the Downtown Green in Old Town Windsor. Thanks to all of our members who supported the bicycle event including Kevin K6BSG, Bob KG6ZDN, and Bob WA6NIV.

On the same day, and again on Sunday, August 19th, others of us participated at the Pacific Coast Air Museum's annual Wings Over Wine Country airshow. The bike event and the airshow activity shared the SCRA repeater system on Saturday, and all communications efforts and facilities worked very smoothly for both events.

On Saturday at the airshow, we presented video clips of SCRA's forthcoming weekend Amateur Radio technician class, presently planned for a yet-to-be-selected October weekend. Our technician class signup sheet at the airshow lists about 15 interested people, and we'll be contacting them with further details and course materials. We're in the final stages of selecting the dates and location for this training session. If you, or someone you know, would like to take the single-weekend class, be sure to contact John, WB6FRZ (johnfrz@comcast.net) or Rich, KF6SZA (kf6sza@arrl.net) and get on our prospect list. Many thanks to John and Rich for pulling the curriculum together and for all of the planning that is going into this most worthwhile Club activity.

On Sunday at the airshow, our booth shifted gears slightly, and we demonstrated APRS tracking on a VHF radio-TNC-laptop computer lash-up running WinAPRS. On both days we featured loudspeaker rebroadcast of the "air boss" control tower radio traffic during the show, we monitored the SCRA Repeater, and we also demonstrated a World

War II vintage BC612 receiver (a show hit among many of the visitors who stopped at our booth). A number of our members, and other local hams, also dropped by the booth and provided some lively conversations and recollections.

We have Brian, N6IIY, aided by PCAM and SCRA member Jerry, WB6LXU, to thank for arranging our appearance at the airshow, and I personally want to thank all of the Club members in addition to Brian who helped out with the SCRA airshow booth on Saturday and Sunday, including John KG6BHI, John WB6FRZ, Joy KI6ASJ, Rich KF6SZA, Pat KG6JSL and Dave KF6CLG. I can tell you from first-hand experience that, based on our interaction with the airshow visitors, considerable interest remains in amateur radio among the public at large. Next year I hope we can provide even more planning, and perhaps bring the Toaster to PCAM, and operate a special event station.

Speaking of our repeater system, it has been suggested that the Club upgrade its 2 meter repeater system at English Hill to handle not only voice traffic, but also data traffic associated with APRS. The addition of "automatic position reporting system" (APRS) data capability to our VHF repeater would be of tremendous use to the Club in carrying out its public service and emergency communications missions. Your Board of Directors will be discussing the SCRA repeater system at its next regular meeting, and I expect that the Board should be able to report to the membership concerning its plans and recommendations. We had no regular board meeting in August for lack of a quorum, because of vacation and work schedule conflicts.

A very special thanks to all of our Tuesday evening service net control volunteers for outstanding work in running the net, and to Brian N7MOE for continuing to make Amateur Radio Newsline available to us.

Finally, I'm delighted to report that SCRA's mentoring program is alive and well! One of our members dropped an older model VHF-UHF handheld off at our booth on Saturday, and each one of us took turns in trying to figure out how to program it. At the end of the day, Brian, N6IIY, took the unit home, downloaded a user manual from the web, programmed the rig, and returned it (along with the manual) to its very pleased owner on Sunday. Well done, Brian! Also, don't miss Brian's presentation on Amateur TV at this month's meeting. We'll also be voting to adopt new articles and bylaws, so your presence
