Sutter KI6ZON has made several new additions to the web site. Be sure to check this out.

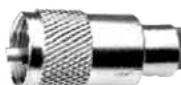

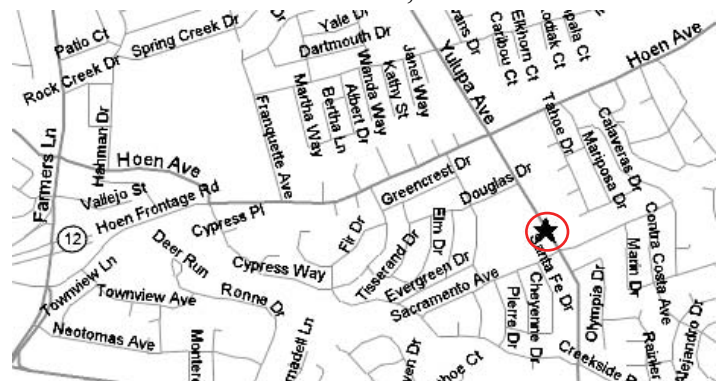

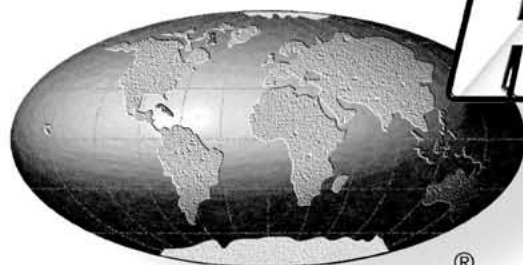

## SCRA Mini DXpedition

Announcing SCRA 2011 Mini DXpedition, scheduled for the weekend of August 13, 2011.

This special event will be a club sponsored Mini-DXpedition to the Lost Coast area of Northern California. Specifically, to activate Maidenhead grid-square CM79.

It's remote and offers some significant challenges. This most sought after grid-square is roughly 1-square mile in area and has no roads, no houses, no power, etc. It is a federal Wilderness area where no vehicles of any kind are allowed.

This will be a Camp-out/hike-in event. Beginning Friday (Aug. 12,) our base camp will be established in a BLM primitive campground nestled in a valley about 7 miles south of the town of Shelter Cove. Saturday we will hike approximately 2.5 miles along a well established trail to the confluence of 40n 124w. This is the N/E corner of CM79. Spend the day setting up, transmitting, and return to the campground for dinner and celebration. Sunday we pack up and drive home.

Everyone is invited. If you are not up for the hike, there will be plenty to do as base-camp support.

Everyone can and is encouraged to participate. If you are up for a hike, great, if not, we can certainly use your talents in base camp, or even as a mobile operator. 

