Besides his wife, Mr. Lowry's survivors include two daughters, Joanne L. Thompson of Orinda and Kathryn J. Donovan of El Cerrito; a brother, Waldo Lowry of Hope, Ark.; a sister, Adelle Rose, of Long Beach; and five grandchildren.

The services will be held at 3 p.m. in the Epworth United Methodist Church, with The Rev. William Dew Jr. officiating.

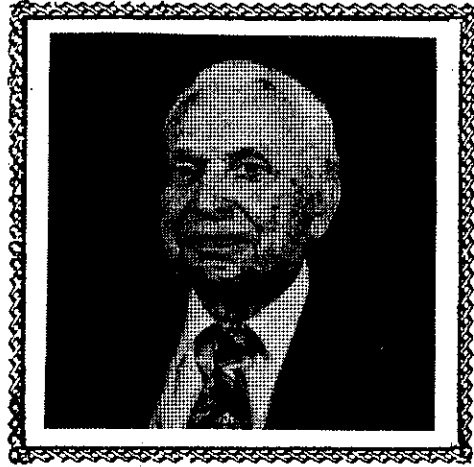

NOW WE SWITCH to Big Sir (not Big Sur). That would be Millard E. George of El Cerrito, who as head of Peralta Branch 12 of Sons of Retirement, holds that peculiar title. But what interests us about him in the moment was his role in something of a communications coup. When Vince Stanitis of Concord suffered a fatal heart attack, George, a ham radio operator, was asked to try to locate Stanitis' young daughter Toni, who was believed to be aboard a small sailboat near San Juan or Haiti or in between. Working with very little information, Millard made contact with a ham in Hawaii, and the broadcast was then picked up by the American Consulate in Port-Au-Prince, which in turn relayed the message to the Sacred Hearts Missionary Radio Network in Cap Haitien. A priest of the order then located Toni in Haiti, and she sped home to be with her mother. . . .
