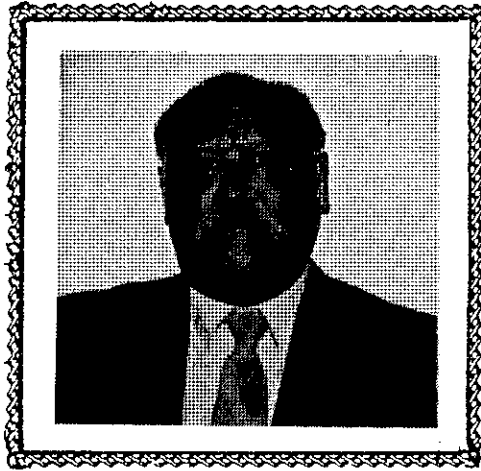

In 1966, my wife and I spent six months touring Europe, England, Scotland and Ireland. Prior to leaving, we had purchased our car through the German Auto Agency in San Francisco for delivery in Paris on a specified date. We flew to New York and sailed for Europe on the SS *United States*.

After four and one-half wonderful days at sea, we landed at LeHavre, France; thence by rail to Paris. We spent 10 days in Paris visiting all of the interesting spots before starting our tour, which took us through 22 countries and driving over 14,000 miles. Our last visit was to Ireland.

Before leaving Paris, hoping to meet some European hams, I had put the following on the back window of the car in large gold-letter decals:

Those of you who have driven over the roads in Ireland know that many of the roads are very crooked, narrow, with stone walls on either side and passing

spaces at intervals. On one of our day trips, we were driving at a low speed over the bad roads when a car approached us from the rear. The driver began honking his horn almost constantly. We naturally assumed he wanted us to speed up, as there were no places where he could pass. Accordingly, I began increasing my speed. However, the faster I went, he — almost on my bumper — kept honking.

Finally, after several miles of this, I waved him down and stopped. He jumped out of his car and rushed to me. At first, I felt sure he was going to punch me in the nose. His first remarks were: "First of all, you owe me the price of two gallons of gas, as I have been following you, out of my way, for over 10 miles trying to get you to stop for an invitation to our house for a 'bit' of Scotch, some refreshments and a nice chat."

He then introduced himself, gave me his call letters and kept insisting that we drive back about 10 miles to his home. Reluctantly we had to decline his invitation as we had hotel reservations to keep many miles up the road.

He was a very interesting young man, with a typical Irish sense of humor and we were sorry to have to reject his invitation. He also stated that he tried to use his horn for sending Morse code to us, but admitted it wasn't possible over the rough road with its many curves. □

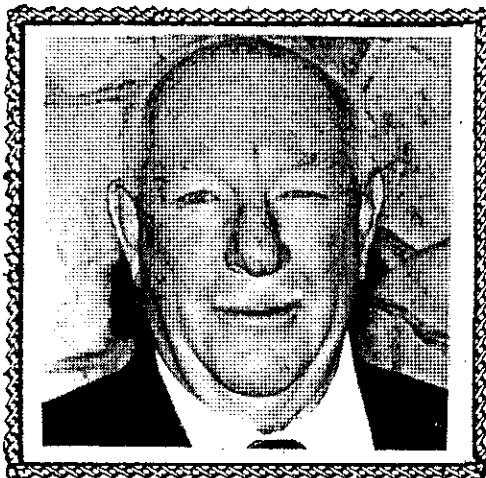

PERSONAL DATA:

Then, after a year's hiatus during which he worked as a journeyman in his parents' CHERRY BLOSSOM Bakery, he returned to academia at the old campus of San Francisco State University, being graduated in 1941 with an A.B. degree and two Teaching Credentials at age 21. He returned to the new campus of S.F.S.U. to receive his Masters Degree and Administrative Credentials in 1955. In the meantime, while still an Undergraduate at S.F.State, Jack also enrolled in the F.A.A. Civilian Pilot Training program at the University of San Francisco, earning his wings as a Private Pilot and Certificated Ground School Instructor in 1940.

PROFESSIONAL CAREER:

Jack embarked on his career as a Public School Music Educator in the Tulare/Reedley areas of the San Joaquin Valley for three years. In 1944, he returned to his home base of S.F. and started his daily commuting to the Oakland Public Schools, wherein he taught Instrumental Music for the next 36 years, retiring in 1980. Also, Jack is now a FIFTY year LIFE MEMBER of the Musician's Union, having joined Local Six in 1938; he has since been continuously performing as a Professional Musician and Dance Band Leader/Music Contractor, as well as a Conductor of Circus Bands, Funeral Bands, and Symphonic and Show Orchestral Groups.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

Shortly after Pearl Harbor, Jack enlisted as a Charter Member of Civil Air Patrol, an Auxiliary of the U. S. Air Force. He served as Commanding Officer of both the Oakland and San Francisco Squadrons in the middle and late 40's. When he was assigned as Communications Officer at the "Group" level circa 1947, he became highly involved in developing the then budding H.F. and V.H.F. radio nets, particularly on the 2 meter band; this activity led him to obtain his HAM ticket in 1965. Jack is still active in C.A.P., presently holding the position of Historian on the Pacific Region Staff. Meanwhile, he was also affiliated with several Police and Sheriff's Departments as a Reserve Officer, holding the rank of Sgt. in the S.F.P.D. for over ten years.

In 1949, he joined S.F.'s ISLAM Shrine Band and in 1970, became its Bandmaster. Also in 1970, he became the Musical Director of the Shrine East-West Football Classic, now held in Stanford Stadium, wherein he has annually conducted Massed High School and Shrine Bands comprised of up to 4,000 Musicians, all starting and hopefully ending at the same time. On the 21st of June of this year, 1988, Jack was Commissioned a "KENTUCKY COLONEL" by the Governor of that State in recognition of many musical contributions and service to the community.

The speaker was Lt. Jos Kereley of N.A.S. who described Navy Communications past, present and touched on possibilities in the future.

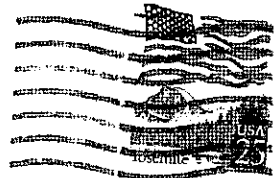
